General Election 4 July!

The electoral commission has a campaign to remind voters that they need photo-ID to vote in person, however their sticky-note advertisements don't make it clear you need <u>approved</u> photo-ID, which is quite limited – especially for younger people, so I've made my own sticky-note.

If you are not sure if you have valid ID, you can apply for a *Voter Authentication Certificate* (VAC) for free, via the web-site, deadline is 26 June. Alternatively you can apply for a postal vote (deadline 19 June) at:

www.gov.uk/apply-postal-vote

Many people are expecting the election campaign to be vicious, with dirty tricks, manipulation, AI and social media fakes including fake fact checking sites. So beware!

By law, all printed election literature must include an imprint to show who is responsible for publishing the material. The Elections Act 2022 extends the imprint requirement to most electronic material which is paid for, however there are some exceptions, and not everyone obeys the law! So doubly beware.

The official statement of candidates nominated will be published Friday 7 June at 5:00pm, I'll include it in next month's Oracle.
