Still buoyant are her golden wings,


Still strong to bear us well.



A report from the unconfirmed minutes of the meeting on 22 January

Present: Cllrs Karen Weir (KW)(chair), David Welsted (DW), Pete Bate (PB), Timothy Birt (TB) and Jeremy Woods (JW)

In Attendance: The Clerk, DC Helen Crane

Apologies: CC Claire Bowes

Matters Arising:

- A planning notification came in informing the Council of planned work to a TPO tree on Church Road
- JW informed the Council that he is in the process of selling his house and may not remain on the Parish Council.
- DW has procured the old Church key mentioned at the last meeting. It is being held by the Parochial Church Council. It was last used to lock the Church during COVID and is not normally used as there is an electronic lock.

Reports:

- The reports from our district councillors were circulated prior to the meeting and are on the web-site.
- DC Crane detailed 'The Link Facility' in the old Council building in Dereham to connect many different services under one roof.

Planning (Notifications):

APP/F2605/W/24/3343596: The Bungalow, Water End Farm, Church Road, OVINGTON. The appeal is made under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) against a refusal to grant planning permission regarding planning application 3PL/2023/1134/F

APPEAL DISMISSED

Accounts and Precept update:

1. To decide on the Precept for 2025/26

There was a discussion on bolstering the ring fenced funds for 'Professional Fees'. It was decided to keep as-is which would mean only a 2% increase was need to balance the budget. DW proposed, TB seconded. The vote was unanimous.

Highways or Village Issues

- 1. TB has had an email from a parishioner who came off the trod due to the surface being unstable. TB proposed to speak to highways asking for the surface to be addressed. Clerk to action
- 2. TB discussed his FoI request to Breckland Council regarding car park budgets. The response indicated that the average cost of running car parks was lower than claimed during the consultation. However, he noted that the whole issue could be side-lined if local government reorganisation removes Breckland Council.
- 3. JW discussed the flooding issue at the end of Church Road. TB to discuss with Highways if an engineer is able to come out to address the issue on the trod.

FREE Village Bus Service

As reported back in October, Konect have introduced a local bus service, the number 15. The service is shared with the number 82 which goes to Attleborough, so the timetable is quite short, nevertheless a useful community asset. It operates Monday to Saturday around Watton, Carbrooke, Saham and Ovington (our stop is opposite Crown Crescent). The timetable is separate from Watton services therefore quite difficult to find on the Konect web-site unless you know so here it is:

Our talk on 12 February follows our brief AGM and is James Symonds giving an update on the work of the NWT Brecks team's work last year.


On 12 March James returns with a talk on Lichens. As Eliot said James is a walking encyclopaedia and his enthusiasm and passion is amazing.
